



I am a multidisciplinary artist and independent researcher with an interest in social justice and embodied storytelling. Sifting through psychological architecture, my work examines the continuously upheld power structures that dominate discourse. With a background in film and scriptwriting, these tools inform how I shape narration, audio, visual elements, and poetic language.

My sound-based works surface out of community engagement, using personal archives, field recordings, and oral histories to explore collective memory, healing, and refusal. It is through this non-acceptance that rituals of refusal and mythology become known, translating these narratives as moments of harm and open abrasions, positioning myself as performer, witness, and choreographer.

Central to my process is collaboration, especially with marginalised voices. I create workshops as generative spaces for people to reconnect with their own stories, sometimes using body mapping, movement, and assemblage to open up non-verbal and verbal channels of expression.

My installation work is designed to be emotionally resonant and accessible, offering intimacy and reflective listening. I work with sensitivity, especially in contexts involving trauma or structural harm. Wherever the work takes place, whether in museums, universities, schools, grassroots contexts, or online, I centre lived experience, creating room for witnessing and grounding each project in care and deep listening.

**Profile** I am a multidisciplinary artist and independent researcher highly motivated in the creative industry, delivering and installing shows as a director, project manager, artist, filmmaker, and workshop facilitator. My work includes engaging with the public in groups and one-on-one settings. Drawing on my diverse skills and research, I transcend the boundaries between art and research to create new hybrid work incorporating movement, performance, and new technologies to disseminate theory as a decolonial practice. Transforming assemblages of objects and images into allegories of experiences, I cut between collage, sculpture, painting, drawings, performance, film, and speculative writing in my practice.
